The President's Chatter



This past month has been a busy and exciting one for the Willamette Valley Woodturners. At the October meeting we had 17 new members join plus one mailed in application from Bend, OR. These new memberships mainly resulted from our exposure at the State Fair. The club now has 104 paid memberships and we expect a few more at the meeting on November 13. At the request of some of the new members we have organized two classes for 14 new turners to be held on November 1. The classes are being hosted by Nick Stagg at his shop; he will be assisted by 8 experienced members who have agreed to mentor these students. That is a great club response to a need. Our thanks to Nick, the mentors, and the new turners who were willing to ask for help. We will be offering another class for new turners, probably in late November or early December.

Another club project is the mentoring of students at North Salem High School. On November 7, about 12 members of our club will spend several hours introducing students in the shop classes to

woodturning. We anticipate that there will be 5 to 7 additional sessions with the students this school year. This was a very rewarding activity when we participated during last winter and we expect it to be equally exciting this school year. The club is currently exploring the possibility of a similar program with another area school. If you would like to participate in mentoring students contact Rick Harris or Bob Hutchinson.

A larger membership allows the club to be able to sponsor workshops or seminars by world-class turners. During October 24-26 a hands on workshop was conducted by Bonnie Klein, one of the best teachers of woodturning in the world. On November 9, there will be a seminar by JoHannes Michelsen where he will demonstrate how to turn his signature piece, a wooden hat. JoHannes Michelsen is world famous for making wooden hats of all kinds, from Stetsons to Bowlers. JoHannes lives in Vermont and seldom makes this western pilgrimage. We are very fortunate that he was able to include us in his schedule. Both of these events are being hosted by Nick Stagg in his shop. Thanks Nick for all you do to help make this a great turning club.

A reminder: at the November meeting we will be voting on a proposal to set membership dues at \$30 per year per membership and voting on a slate of officers for 2009.

Club membership should be renewed before Jan. 1.

Since then I've enjoyed turning tops, boxes, pens, platters, kaleidoscopes and some segmented bowls and vases.

No other club member contacted the committee and requested to be considered for an office. The club thanks the committee for its efforts.

This slate will be put in nomination at the November meeting. Other nominations will be accepted from the floor.

Vote on raising yearly dues.

To be voted on at the November meeting. Dues for the club were established as \$20 per year when the club was founded in 1997. At that time we were meeting in a middle school shop and did not have to pay rent. Like everyone else, the club now pays more for everything we purchase in support of our activities. We now rent space for our meetings, provide gas money to non-club presenters, underwrite workshops with name callers, underwrite expenses for special events, and pay for such things as our photo roster, and postage for an expanded newsletter. An increase in dues is necessary to continue the operation of the club at its current level. The board has proposed that dues be set at \$30 per year starting in 2009, and that a membership include all family members. Each membership will receive one vote for issues brought before the club.

December Meeting Auction/Potluck Dessert

The December 11, meeting of the Willamette Valley Woodturners will again be the annual auction/potluck. Family members and friends are welcome. The potluck will be a dessert potluck not a meal, additional food and drink will not be provided by the club. As in the past members are encouraged to donate turned pieces that will be auctioned. The auction has in the past provided a substantial portion of the club's operating budget. There will be a Christmas Ornament exchange for those members who wish to participate: 1. Bring an ornament which you have turned in the past year. 2. Fill out an Instant Gallery form and leave the form and ornament at the check-in table and receive a raffle ticket. 3. At raffle time a spouse may choose an ornament as their ticket number is called or, if there are too many, a raffle ticket will be randomly drawn and attached to each ornament, the spouse gets the ornament bearing their ticket number. Assuming that the honor system works, each member bringing an ornament should leave with a different ornament. There will also be a special raffle for a quilt made and donated by a member's spouse.

5:00 --5:30 Place donated pieces, ornaments, and desserts on the appropriate tables, socialize.

5:30 – 6:30 Dessert potluck, and viewing of auction items and ornaments.

6:30 – 7:00 Ornament exchange, clean-up from potluck, and put away residual dessert items.

7:00 – 9:00 Auction Additional non-club members may join us for the auction. Purchased items will be paid for at the end of the auction.

The Secretary's Minutes

Club Meeting Minutes for October 09, 2008

There were 67 people present...including 20 visitors. Seven of the visitors joined this evening.

Walt outlined the agenda for our meeting for our members and visitors and then Nick introduced our presenter, Bill McCoy who would be demonstrating the art of making Christmas ornaments. Nick also announced that we would be having an ornament exchange in December.

Bill started out by turning a round ball...doing some sanding with 80 grit as he progressed. Next he drilled a 3/8" inch hole all the way through...with a large hole on one end and a small one on the other. His next step was to begin the hollowing out process using a square nosed scraper and then continuing to use a variety of tools to complete the process. Be sure to mark the depth on your tools so that you don't go in too far. He recommends that ornaments be about 1/8 " thick to cut down the weight as much as possible. Once the thickness was correct, the ball was removed from the lathe. Bill then demonstrated how to clean the glue off the bottom.

Prior to the break, Walt announced:

1. The upcoming workshop at Nick Stagg's house.

2. Those who entered the fair would get a gift certificate and that Jerry Lelack would get two additional certificates for entering the most categories.
3. He also named Rick Harris as member of the month for all his hard work with North Salem, the Oregon State Fair and various wood collection activities.
4. We will be voting on new officers at the November meeting
5. We will be voting on whether to raise the dues from \$20 to \$30 per year

Break at 7:22-Resumed at 7:40

After the break, Bill demonstrated turning the icicle for the end of the ornament. He utilized holly for the icicle because of its extremely fine grain. He also turned the small top for the ornament and showed how to drill a hole and insert a tiny eye. He used a chatter tool to make the pattern for the top. He normally uses Deft spray for finishing his ornaments, 2 to 3 coats. Bill purchases steel for his specialty tools from Enco Steel.

Walt drew first 5 numbers for drawing.

Break from 8:35 to 8:43

Nick reviewed the display table and pointed out several things, including a spindle string handle for a kite, an open vessel from JJ, a small bowl with a turquoise inlay from Pete Peterson, and a three footed ebony swirl bowl by Keith Walker.

Board Meeting Minutes for October 16, 2008

Call to order 7:00

Nomination Committee reported on the slate of candidates to be presented to the membership.

The December meeting was discussed. The event consists of a dessert, social time and auction. It was proposed that we have an ornament exchange. If there are only a few who participate, they could draw a number and pick one. If there are a lot of ornaments then we can draw numbers and attach the numbers to them. An alternative proposal to bring them and donate them to the senior center was not adopted. We are also planning on raffling a quilt.

Walt proposed dessert from 5:30 – 6:30. At 6:30 the ladies can pick their ornaments and the auction would start at 7:00. Keith suggested that we put it in the newsletter so that everyone knows to take their leftovers home with them. Ornament exchange is a go. Gary will take care of the money from the auction and get someone to help him.

Neva will bring wrap and zip lock bags to take care of leftovers.

We will be paying the same amount for the new facility for one year. After that, we don't know what the cost will be and this supports the need for an increase in dues.

Classes for beginners will start on the Nov. 1st. We have a good group of students and are still working on mentors. It will be at Nick's house. Rick discussed provisions for wheelchair bound members and will follow up on trying to meet that need.

It was suggested that we talk to Nick about a stipend to help cover the cost of having events at his house. The board authorized Walt to talk to him about it. It was felt that the club should help cover the cost of power, tool usage etc.

Walt discussed the advantage of doing group orders of tools to cut down on the cost of shipping and also take advantage of Craft Supply's offer of a 13% discount for orders of \$1000 or more. Walt is willing to do this on behalf of the club. The board agreed on this..

Membership-It was proposed that our membership be a family membership and that votes be one per membership. The annual fee should be \$30 and cover the whole family. The new fee will be voted upon at the November meeting. We held some discussion about the need for a bigger reserve in order to have a little larger buffer for future activities.

Darren brought a draft of a possible plan for updating our web site. His basic approach is to poll the members to determine their needs and usage before we start any major update of the web site and as we make changes we create a user hand book so that future "webmasters" can maintain the web site. We agreed that we should review the needs of the members before we do anything major. Darren said that after the first of the year, he would look into the needs and opinions of the membership. Keith would like to expand the hints section.

Rick Harris is going to stay on the board as a special events coordinator for the next year and his first project will be working with North Salem High School as well as other schools to find opportunities to work with students.
