November demonstrator:

Walt has been turning for the past 40 years. Walt can't settle down to doing one type of turning, with the exception of mushrooms which he does at the club's public demos. He turns a variety of items bowls and platters us to 24" diameter to thimbles. His current favorites are Christmas ornaments.



Let the bidding begin!

The tools donated by **Woodcrafters** (thank you Dwayne!) will be auctioned off with proceeds to benefit the club at this month's meeting. The tools each retailed from \$45-\$65. They look like they were lightly used. The JoolTool sharpening system is brand new and retailed for about \$280.

There are 4 handles, each holding different sized diameter tools: $\frac{3}{8}$ ", $\frac{1}{2}$ ", $\frac{5}{8}$ ", and $\frac{3}{4}$ ". As shown in the pics, the flat carbide tools fit either $\frac{3}{8}$ " or $\frac{1}{2}$ ". There are no tools matching the $\frac{5}{8}$ " handle. 2 tools fit the $\frac{3}{4}$ " handle. 2 tools stand alone. All the handles have the allen wrench used to lock the tool housed in their base.

Bidding will be silent with each lot having a sheet for your name and bid. Bidding will end at the conclusion of break. Winners will be announced at the end of the meeting. Cash or check accepted!

Larry covered the following announcements:

- -Empty Bowls (see note in Marc's message above)

- -Board nominations: all present board members up for reelection for 2023 and were nominated by **Jeff**. Voting to happen at November meeting.
- -Craft Supplies order: Jeff announced we'd made the \$1K threshold and the order had been placed (current order as of this writing is at \$143).

Presenter Tom Willing

Tom began promptly at 7PM with his presentation on how he makes spheres. Tom told a bit of his history as a teacher and turning hobbyist which has blossomed into a busy schedule as a presenter.

Tom's detailed notes generously donated to the club are found in the **Members Only** section of our website and found under the heading **Presenter Files**. If you haven't seen them, they are well worth the look and are way more detailed and useful than any description I could provide. Check them out!

Tom provides great detail from beginning to the end of the process. The only note he mentioned in his presentation that I didn't see in the sanding section is that he primarily sands with the lathe in reverse. Of course, I may have just missed it. His detail is quite remarkable!

Tom sells his spheres from \$20-\$65 depending on size, species, figuring, and other interesting features.

Tom shared that spheres are not like bowls in how they are seen as aesthetic mainly in function, but that the skills needed and honed in their creation are vital in all other turning. (On a personal note, spheres I've given to teachers I work with are reported as the most handled by students on a daily basis.)

The Beads of Courage program teams up with doctors and nurses to help children with long term illness. As kids go through their journey, they receive beads to commemorate their operations and treatments.





Membership Rewards

Chain Sharpening Service from Jeff Zens: I have an electric chain sharpener and can accurately sharpen your chains and adjust depth stops for your saw chains. This service will restore the chain to "factory-new" condition. Most chains for 18" and shorter bars can be sharpened for \$10.00. Longer chains (up to 30" bars) are \$20.00 Badly damaged chains might be a little bit more. I will also tell you if the chain has reached the end of its useful life, and will not sharpen a chain beyond that point. This price is <u>only</u> available for club members.

- *Half round protractors (\$6) used to measure the angle ground on a tool
