Current & Upcoming Events

Summer Demonstrations

The club has accepted invitations to staff a demonstration booth at two events this year: the Steam-up at the Powerland Museum at Brooks, OR and the State Fair. We are invited to demonstrate at the Steam-up both weekends of the event: July 24-25 and July 31 - August 1, from 8:00 to 4:00 each day.

The State Fair organization has asked us to demonstrate six days, September 1 - 6 from 10 AM through 8 PM. The club will conduct itself about the same at both events: 1. Bring mini lathe with safety shield and turning tools. 2. Each member can decide what they want to turn and bring the appropriate materials. Visitors will often stand long enough to see a small object turned to completion. However, if there are a variety of things being worked on having a long term project or two is not bad. Those who participate will get free passes to the events for that day. 4. No-one need stay at the demonstration booth all day. 5. Any member who wishes to demonstrate will be welcome to do so and should plan to wear their club name tag and blue T-shirt (which will be provided by the club).

If you can't make it to a meeting to sign-up please call or email. Sign-up even if you can only make it for a half day. Last year we had a great turn-out for both demonstrations. We can easily accommodate 10 people in the booths at one time.

The steam-up will be coordinated by Myron Yancey (503-623-8930) and the State Fair will be coordinated by Bob Hutchinson (503-508-3279).

Wood Gathering

Sign-up sheets will be available to indicate your availability to help with wood gathering. Anyone who learns of a tree or log that is available to the club should notify Jerry Lelack (503 510-1577) or Bob Hutchinson (503 508-3279). The intent is to gather wood, process it to usable pieces, store it at the home of Terry Gerros', and then make it available to members. Terry can be reached at 503 580-5013.

Jerry Lelack is still hoping for donations of mini-lathe size rounds, oblongs, or squares of any type of wood that will be used as gifts to new members – some way to get them started in the world of wood turning.

From Terry....People need to come get some of the wood that is being stored here. There is English walnut, chinaberry, black locust, birch, cherry, and most recently, some maple. First come, first choice. You are invited to come anytime M-F between 9-5pm, Saturday 9-5pm. The wood pile is continuing to grow so please come and take your share. Drive behind the clinic and take as much as you like, cherry pick, be greedy, but come and get some wood. Those of you bringing wood....Call and schedule the drop off with me before you arrive. Remember this storage is for harvested wood only. Do not under any circumstances bring wood from your wood pile and leave at my place.

Terry Gerros is currently selling turning blanks for a friend. The blocks are at wholesale price or below and consist primarily of figured walnut (both claro and English). The blocks are dried and waxed, ready to turn to the finished product. Also available are stabilized pen blanks (figured maple, speckled maple, myrtle wood, buckeye burl), bottle stoppers (buckeye burl), and spindle stock of varying sizes and types of wood. I do not make a penny on these sales. You are welcome to come see the wood and purchase on Saturdays, please call to make sure I am available.

All bowl blanks are 3" thick give or take a bit, and are both English and claro walnut, some have both types grafted together, lots of fiddleback, marbling. These blocks are cut from gunstock material. Some maple pieces are available. Will be expecting more maple, buckeye burl and myrtle wood in the future.

Workshops / Presentations

Sawdust Sessions

A sawdust session is an opportunity for hands-on learning. Those who have a portable lathe are asked to bring them and an appropriate chuck. The club has one portable lathe that will be available. We expect to share the lathes so that all who want to turn will get some lathe time. Any member is welcome to come and bring tools to work with or projects that are causing you a problem. Help will be available. Normally a sawdust session

will not involve a formal presentation such as we have at monthly meetings. I urge new members to come. It is a great way to meet other members and develop your turning skills.

There will be a sawdust session on July 21 at the shop of Bruce Stangeby, 432 Stoneway Dr NW, Salem. This is going to be different than the normal type of sawdust session. Gary McGuire, Myron Yancey and Bruce Stangeby are going to have on hand many of the different types of sharpening equipment that is available. We will demonstrate its use and it will be available for you to try. Bring some tools that need sharpening and we will explore many different ways to do the job. The sawdust session will be from 10:00 to 3:00. Bring a lunch and come for the day or stop by anytime.



Eli Avisera will present a two day workshop on July 22 and 23, for which we still have room for two or three people. If you are not familiar with his exquisite work please look around his web sight. www.avisera.co.il/. The cost is \$195 for this two-day class.

Eli is an excellent teacher and an innovative turner. He's taught all over the world and is one of very few turners that can produce spindles (tremblers), bowls, boxes (his Dreidel box where the lid acts as a top), exquisite hollow vessels and very high quality segmented work. He also does piercing and other forms of surface enhancement. He's accomplished in all aspects of woodturning. In addition, Eli has a unique double bevel grind he puts on his tools and grinds his skewers with a convex bevel.

He's a very well rounded turner and if you're on the fence about taking the class, don't be.....you won't regret it. I'm very much looking forward to the class.... I hope to see you here! NICK
