February Demonstration (Thursday, February 9, 2012)

Presenter, Bruce Stangeby Topic: Small end-grain bowls on stands

Locally known (well at least a couple people know him), Bruce is recognized for his small end-grain bowls on stands, commonly known as goblets. He is the current President of our club and has recently demonstrated the Beaver State Woodturners in Eugene. A self-proclaimed tool junkie and wood hoarder, Bruce is commonly found in the company of his wife, bowling on Tuesday morning, instead of spending time at the lathe. March Demonstration (Thursday, March 9. 2012)

Presenter: Larry Miller, Olympia, WA.

Topic: Stacked boxes and demo on the Klein Threading jig.

"What started as a hobby has turned into an addiction," but hopefully after looking at Larry's web site you'll agree it's one of the better addictions. He creates wood products that he calls "functional art", or in other words everything Larry makes has not only a function, but also shows off the beauty of the wood. All the wood he uses comes from trees that have been removed for environmental purposes or from recovered "fire wood". These one-of-a-kind works of art last generations as evidenced from the first salad bowl he created for his mother in high school about 50 years ago and as functional today as it was then.

Larry is also involved with the American Association of Woodturners youth program. At the annual AAW symposium, vendors donate 25 woodturning stations (lathes, tools, safety gear, chucks) and classes are conducted by experienced woodturners to up to 25 students at a time. Then when the symposium is over, the 25 woodturning stations are given to 25 lucky students whose names are drawn out of a hat. This is a great program. There are usually between 60 and 100 youth enrolled in the program at each symposium.



<u>March Demo/Workshop</u>: As an impromptu event, Larry will also be available to do a **either** an all day demo on turning a *ceremonial urn*, depending on the number of people who sign up. A one day workshop has already been filled for the Saturday following the club meeting, but Friday is open. We need to have at least 18 people for the demo or 5 people for the Friday workshop. Larry's day rate is \$450.00, so 4

trying to keep costs down, 18 people at the demo will cost each person \$25.00. If that doesn't fly and we have only 5 people to do the workshop, that cost will be \$90.00. Please let me know ASAP.

Before we left, I talked Mike into leaving a number of turning blanks to sell to the members of our club. Currently I have Ambrosia maple, Honey Locust, Mineral stained Poplar and a few other species available. There are some really nice blanks available in many different sizes. Mike also has left several sections of Maple burl logs. The log sections are at my place and have the price painted on them. If you have an interest, let me know and we can make arrangements for you to come by and take a look. I have a chainsaw large enough to cut these log sections so you can handle them.
