President's Message – September, 2019

A Message About Safety at the Lathe

This month, our club's focus is on our new members. If State Fair is any indication, we should have a pretty good turnout of new folks at the September meeting as well as a few surprises for the "old timers". When we deal with new members, we should always have safety in mind: discussing and understanding the risks and dangers involved in any woodworking endeavor is our obligation as we work to pass along this craft to others. We read about it, and talk about it. Demonstrators at our meetings discuss it. But how many of us really – *really* – take lathe safety seriously?

I had the opportunity to demonstrate at our booth almost every evening during our State Fair appearance. Keeping in mind our obligation to do this work safely and set that example, I wear my helmet when I turn. It's an annoyance when trying to speak to an interested observer, and I took it off (and put it back on) dozens of times. Saturday night, I was really happy I put it back on after talking to some potential new members. I was working on a small bowl that I had roughed out in June, and was taking a very fine last pass on the outside of the bowl when it blew up. This wasn't a catch: we examined the fragments for any evidence of torn grain or the signature spiral, and found nothing. My best guess is the piece had developed a small internal crack that finally let loose at that precise moment. It was a loud "explosion" that startled everyone in the area. A large piece of the bowl struck my helmet – hard. Here are two photos that illustrate the aftermath:



The scuff mark on the helmet would have been a bad laceration on my forehead but for the helmet. My first thoughts after the initial surprise wore off ran along the lines of "I hope none of the parts bounced past the safety shield into the crowd!" Fortunately, none had, and only then did I start thinking about what a mess this would have been without the protection of the helmet and the safety glasses I wear under the visor. We have all heard demonstrators talk about wearing their safety shields in their own shops but not at demonstrations because of the difficulty communicating with the audience. Maybe Airshield or another vendor will do something about that one day. Until then, whenever I demonstrate, I'm sticking with the helmet, or a visor, AND my safety glasses. I hope, when you teach new woodturners, you will do the same. I will have the helmet and the bowl at September's meeting if you're interested.




Upcoming Events

Supplies
