President's Message November, 2019

Woodturning Memories

I suspect many of our members can remember their first woodturning experience. Mine was in seventh grade Shop Class, and I didn't get injured, always a plus for a know-nothing seventh grader. My teacher, Mr. Hannah, let me turn a bowl – after I finished a full semester of mechanical drawing work, cut a table saw push stick on the band saw, built a tool tote and completed all the other mandatory shop assignments. After all the “work” was done, then I could turn a bowl.

But first I had to prepare a bowl blank which in seventh grade shop in the 1960s meant gluing up some 2x12 stock of a species I don't remember, then waiting a few days for the glue to cure, cutting off the corners on the bandsaw and finally mounting this massive block on a faceplate. Fortunately, seventh graders are too stupid to be afraid, and when this seventh grader stepped up to the lathe, gouge in hand, fear wasn't on my mind. I do remember thinking, “OK, now what?” Fortunately Mr. Hannah showed me a few basic cuts, and I managed to remove everything that wasn't a bowl from that glued-up chunk of rapidly spinning disfigurement. Did I mention that this was in the days where face shields were not to be found in shop classes?

Several class periods later I finished the bowl. I unscrewed it from the faceplate and covered the screw holes with a piece of green felt, because that's what you did back then. I think the finish was linseed oil – but don't ask me to swear to it. I proudly gave this bowl to my mom, maybe for Christmas, or a birthday, or maybe I just brought it home from school one day.

This somewhat crude bowl became our family salad bowl. It lasted a lot of years. Ten years ago this month, when we were cleaning out her Milwaukee apartment after her death, I found the bowl in a closet. It looked a lot darker than I remember, but years of being used as a salad bowl will do that to wood.

I have the bowl now, a long way away from where it came to life a long time ago. I don't use it as a salad bowl any more. I just look at it and think of my mom.






Figure 1 Texturing provided by Arbor Saw





Figure 9 Hal Schalles,

Saturday 1/11 workshop. \$100 per student. Wood and lunch provided, Tools optional.

This hands on workshop class will focus on learning how to turn and complete a hollow vessel. Either if you have hollowing experience or none; students will learn how to turn a hollow vessel from start to finish or improve their hollowing skills they already have. We will start by turning a smaller simple bowl or open form making practice cuts on the inside with different hollowing tools to get a good understanding how the tools are cutting. This will allow us to easily see what it takes to make a clean accurate cuts with different available hollowing tools before we start a more challenging hollow form. We will also go over effective tool grip techniques, body stances, and sharpening our cutter tips to reduce vibrations for clean cuts.
